

Standing as a silent sentry greeting members entering American Legion Post 10 in Manassas, Virginia, where I am an active member of The Sons of The American Legion, is a 1954 Willys M38A1, affectionately known as "*THE Jeep*" by members.

Built for the United States Marine Corp. in September 1954 by Willys Motors, Inc. *(pronounced Willis)* in Toledo, Ohio, the Post 10 Jeep is formally known by military nomenclature as *Truck*, *Utility*, 4 X 4, M38A1 and was one of 101,488 built – 80,290 for domestic use

and 21,198 for export. Built between 1952 and 1971, the M38A1 saw extensive use in Korea and Vietnam by all branches. They were well-liked by the military, and many claim it was the best Jeep ever produced. Its predecessor was the WWII-era MB, and its successor was the Ford M151, which was prone to rollover, and was not well accepted by the military, especially after driving the M38A1s.

The Jeep tips the scale at 2,660 pounds and is powered by a 72 horsepower 134 cubic inch (2.2litre) four-cylinder engine, has a Borg-Warner 3-speed transmission, and has a top *recommended* speed of 55 mph, although they will go faster. It was designed to

"snorkel" and a vertical exhaust pipe which extended the air intake and exhaust several feet above the windshield and necessitated the 24 volt electrical and ignition system to be waterproof, which increased the complexity and cost of repairs and maintenance. When fording deep water, the driver would pull out a handle on the dashboard to activate

and butterfly valves, diverts the air intake to the snorkel while creating a slight pressure inside the Marine Corp Jeeps were painted 34052 forest green crankcase to keep water from entering through the seals. The system creates many vacuum-related operational issues when not in use, so the one on this Jeep has been deactivated.

Unfortunately, after attempting to research the service history of our Jeep, I found out that the military

never kept records of where each one served. So, it's anyone's guess as to the history of ours. More than likely, it served stateside, as military historians have informed me that most Jeeps serving overseas were

left there. We aren't sure if the numbers stenciled on the hood are the original number assigned to it or a personal preference of a previous owner.

The Post 10 Jeep was built to specific Marine Corps. specifications that differed from other M38A1s serving in other branches, which included reinforced front and rear bumpers with lifting rings for air the fording system, which, through a series of cables transport, additional waterproofing, and undercoating, along with rear limited-slip differentials. All

with flat yellow numbering on the hood. Any additional lettering was typically done after delivery to its unit.

The Jeep was obtained on March 29, 2004, from a Manassas area collector, and supporting documentation indicates that it was not titled until October 2008.

The monthly meeting of the Bull Run Region was held on April 16, 2023 at the Manassas VFW Hall with 19 members in attendance. The following were the issues discussed:

- 2. Treasurer's Report: Read and approved.
- 3. President's Report:
- 4. Pete talked about the proposed Show and Shine at the Virginian Assisted Living facility on Jun 17. So far he received two positive responses only. He needs to confirm with the facility whether the Region will support this effort. We need about 10 cars from 11 am to 2 pm that day, which is the day before Father's day. There is no judging or awards, but a lunch will be provided to participants. Five more members agreed to participate at the meeting. Pete will contact the facility and tell them it is a go. Thanks to all who volunteered.

- 5. Pete asked Jennifer Gilkey to inform the members on the purchase of new magnetic signs for use at parades and other club events. She reported that we can have the signs made featuring the Region logo and website, in color, size 2 foot by 3 foot for \$12 per sign. The price was based on purchasing 12 signs. The membership was in favor of the purchase, but questioned the size. Jennifer will check on the size of the current signs and place the order.
- 6. Pete proposed that we make the Lifetime Membership award, given last year to the Cross's, a permanent award of the Region. This award would make the individual a Region member for life at no cost in recognition of their long term service to the Region. He suggested that only one award be presented annually to a deserving member. He would like to leave the criteria open to allow for multiple situations that the Region may want to honor. If no member seems deserving, the award does not have to be presented each year. The members approved this idea.
- 7. Pete then made a motion nominating Bill & Kathryn Sessler for a Lifetime Membership Award. Bill has been a member of the Region for

- 51 years, held every elected position except OD-MA representative, won every Region award, worked all 47 annual car shows, hosted several picnic meetings, stores and maintains Region property and regularly attends monthly meetings. He is always there to help with anything the Region needs. The motion was seconded and the members voted to award a Lifetime Membership to Bill & Kathryn by unanimous vote.
- 8. Rohr Show report: Gene Gilkey and Randy Higgins informed the members that the arrangements with the new venue are complete and the Masons are very excited to host our event. They will be running their own food concession at the show, but we have complete control over the field layout and show processing. The area is about three times larger than the past venue so we have many options. Decisions are still in the works but all is running smoothly. The Region will have to pay a \$250 use fee to the Lodge, but that is minor compared to the City's request. Flyers are available for members to spread the word and sponsors will be solicited. Past attendees are being emailed a flyer, Pete has sent is out to Region members, the information and flyer are on the website and Facebook page, and the Crusin-For-Heroes are handing out flyers. More information will follow.
- 9. ODMA: Franklin Gage reported that the Fall Tour is scheduled for early November and that they are looking for a Region to host the annual show for 2024. He also reported that the 2023 show went well considering the inclement weather. Rick Pozdol and Pete Pandolfi both received Senior awards for their cars and the Region won the Edgar Rohr Trophy again this year.

Traveling to Nationals and other events across the country, I have noticed some of our chapters and regions are passing out their newsletters to potential new members and spectators. Have you ever thought about using your newsletter as a marketing/ membership tool? Here are some examples: One chapter sets up a tent at the local Cars & Coffee and passes out copies of Antique Automobile and their newsletter along with the AACA brochure and their local brochure. All of these have a contact website printed on them. Last year at one of our Nationals, the sponsoring region printed up a brief magazine about the event, AACA, their region and local area. Strategically placed, there was a membership application in it. I took a picture of the show field; and when I looked at it, I saw one of those magazines in the hands of virtually every spectator. Now, that's a great example of good marketing! Okay, I know our editors are mentally estimating the cost, but how much would you be willing to pay for an influx of new members, great public relations in your area and the spreading of the mission of AACA?

As the Vice President of Publications, I read dozens of newsletters each month. All of them are interesting let someone know that is where you will be and ask and well worth reading. And yes, a primary purpose of your newsletter is to inform and motivate your current local membership. Of course, it is! Most of us the owner pinned underneath and no one knew it had seem to have our in-reach down pat. But now take another look at your newsletter. How could you add some out-reach? April Meeting Presentation

With Show Season just beginning, Randy Higgins gave a short presentation on things to consider as our hobby exits its winter hibernation. Overall the message was check out your car before putting it on the road. Make sure the fluid levels are within a safe range, check your tire pressure and make sure it is free from debris and other hazards before taking it out of storage. You never know what might have

The biggest thing is that safety comes first. Your garage should contain a first aid kit and fire extinguisher. Randy recommends two fire extinguishers, one on each end of the garage so that no matter where a fire breaks out, you can access a fire extinguisher. He also recommends these fire extinguishers be of the larger variety with a hose. The small ones we all carry in our classics is good for shows but is not enough to handle a fire in the garage.

Perhaps the most dangerous area while working on you classic car is under the car. Randy reminds us that before getting under a car that is raised above the floor to make sure it is properly jacked up and stabilized. He recommends using a hydraulic floor jack over a bottle jack and the placement of jack stands under the vehicle. Remember anything can fail and you do not want your car to come crashing down on you. Here is an instance where a little redundancy may be worth it. Generally, you do not have time to get out from under the car once it starts to fall. A combination of the floor jack and stands may but you a little time to get clear in the event one of the systems fails.

Another great idea he put forward is one we perhaps never think about. Before getting to work on the car, them to check on you periodically. As a fire fighter, he has seen several instances where the vehicle had even happened. It may seem inconvenient, but it could well save you life when things go sour.

Intermittent starting issues plagued the Jeep for a couple of years, which is where I developed my love-hate relationship with it. When it started and ran, I loved it, but when it wouldn't start, I wanted to shove it over a cliff. After spending hours trying to diagnose the

problem, I enlisted the help of several of my fellow "gear heads" to help brainstorm the starting issue, but the answer was elusive. We all agreed it had to be something in the ignition system, but we couldn't pinpoint it. Persistence paid off when, after getting a tip from an online military Jeep group, I checked the wire inside of the distributor and found that although it appeared in good shape, it was actually broken on that the seat covers in the Jeep needed to be replaced the inside, causing it to short out and prevent starting. along with a new canvas top — both of which were It was a simple issue, after all. Since then, the Jeep has been upgraded to a 24-volt Pertronix electronic ignition which improved starting and driving tremendously.

In April of this year, the Jeep was driven to my shop, where the badly worn clutch was replaced, the transmission rebuilt, and a new water pump and radiator installed, along with routine fluid changes.

The maintenance of an old vehicle never ends, but it pays off when you see the smiles of kids waving in a parade or hear a veteran reminisce about their service with a similar Jeep. For me, the joy I see on the faces of the veterans who ride in the Jeep with me during parades and other events is priceless.




ODMA Annual Car Show




