# **Car of the Month 1957 Volkswagen Oval Beetle**

While listening to the wonderful presentations at the AACA 2024 Annual Awards Dinner, I realized that sharing our story is an important part of being a member. Many of us believe our old cars have a soul that speaks for the past, and stays with us into the future. As I'm wring this, Volkswagen of America is marking 75 years in the U.S. with a touching 2024 Super Bowl commercial titled "An American Love Story." To view the commercial go to

My story started around the time half a million people gathered at Woodstock, not far from my home in New York. I was 16 years old and hinting to my dad that I'd love to own an American muscle car. A few weeks later he rolled into the driveway in a 1958 VW beetle that barely ran. My dad served 22 years in the U.S. Navy as a submariner

during WWII and the Korean War and was able to fix anything that came along. The 58 VW became our training platform and soon afterwards we started doing minor repairs for friends that led to overhauling engines. To pay for college, I started buying VWs with mechanical problems, fixing them, and reselling them for a profit. We loved

clever simplicity of VWs and our stories and personal bond during this time lasted until he passed at 94 years old. I did not realize it at the time, but buying and selling VWs gave me fundamental business skills that helped prepare me for my professional career.

After attending college and owning several VWs to include a 52 split window that I sold to my buddy for \$200 (ouch), I joined the U.S. Army. My future wife Fran joined me at Fort Hood, TX with her 71 VW bus that we later traded for a 76 sun-yellow VW beetle. We drove the beetle during our 20-year military career and had so many adventures - like getting lost in the

fog on the Autobahn and almost crossing into East Germany when the wall was still up.

During my second career with the Central Intelligence Agency, we bought a 1967 beetle and drove it for years until we discovered our 1957 VW Oval for sale at a car show. On 3 September 2017, Fran and I were at the Virginia Dominion Raceway Bugout and noticed a 57 Oval parked inside the Speedway. There

was a for sale sign with a cell phone number on the seat and I started getting excited about the chance of owning an Oval. People started gathering around the car and I crawled underneath the chassis looking for rust and body damage. After a careful inspection and finding nothing wrong, I knew this was an incredible find. We found the owner and took the car for a test drive. There was nothing mechanically wrong that concerned me. It shifted perfectly and was "rock solid" at all speeds. We bought the car on the spot, named it "Abbey Road" and drove her 75 miles on Interstate 95 to her new home.

Abbey Road came off the production line on 28 January 1957 in Wolfsburg, Germany and exported to Boston, MA. She was a deluxe model with red leatherette seats, tubeless tires, and the latest hydraulic

braking system. Abbey was one of only 38,129 VW sedans produced that year and is distinctive for her rear oval window. There were three owners before us and we were able to verify its history on the road and 28-year storage in the last owner's garage. The first owners paid about \$1,495 for the car and drove it for 25 years. The second owner was a mechanic and had responded to an ad for old cars to support the filming of the 1987 movie "Tin Men" with Richard Dreyfuss and Danny DeVito. Fran and I found him still living in Baltimore, MD where they filmed the movie. He told us how the production company selected the car to play a key role in the movie, and shared is wonderful experience working with the cast and crew for a few days. It was obvious from our conversations with him that his devoted caring for the Oval is why it survived in such exceptional original condition.

After a few months we faced a common decision point among old car enthusiasts. Do we keep her

Eventually only a shell remained. Our team re

built the 1192cc engine to stock specifications using the best German parts available. We stripped the interior and exterior old black paint to bare metal and had it professionally repainted in its original L41 black

#### The National Beat

The following article entitled "Consider Strategic Planning" was written by Mel Carson, AACA Vice President—Legislation. It was originally published in the Winter 2023 Rummage Box.

Why is Strategic Planning important? Regions and Chapters need direction and organization goals to work toward. Strategic Planning offers that type of guidance. Essentially, a Strategic Plan is a roadmap to goals. Without such guidance, it is difficult to know if your Region or Chapter is on the right road to reach its goals.

In general, Planning can be considered as three phases: 1-Strategic Planning is the long-term planning for the achievement and survival of the organization. 2-Tactical Planning is short-term planning that helps understand and break down Strategic Planning in parts to move forward. 3-Operational Planning is used to implement Strategic Planning more often in short steps, such as office procedures.

The Strategic Planning process includes: Analyze Requirements; Develop Objectives; Plan the Process with a Budget; Execute with an Approved Budget; Monitor Progress. Strategic Planning is not a "one and May 17-18 - ODMA Show, Roanoke, VA done" process. Any plan must be continually reworked and updated with a regular process. "Sometimes more time is spent discussing and planning than in doing" – to quote one expert. Google 'Strategic Planning' to find more information.

possible. Thanks to our members, we provided four cars for display; Bill Sessler's 1933 Pontiac, Jim and Sally Batchelder's 1957 Chevy Belair, Richard Porter's 1965 Mustang convertible and perhaps most importantly Chip and Nancy Rohr's 1912 Buick. This Buick has a long AACA history and is recognized by a majority of AACA members.

John Price once again took the lead in managing the movement and display of these vehicles along with the help of the car owners, Eugene Gilkey, Steve Deitz, and Randy Higgins. Both the Pontiac and the Buick were trailered to the site. On the surface this seemed like a simple, straight forward task, but it wasn't. There were Fairfax County fire code safety rules to follow, the cars were not allowed to drive on the carpeted floors, so large tarps had to be laid down, and the 1912 Buick, to be displayed in the hotel rotunda, barely fit through the interior doors. Our people spent hours on the Tuesday before the convention to get the cars in place. Once in place, the car tires had to rest on a plastic film, similar to Saran wrap, so they did not touch the carpet. This film had all the clinginess problem of actual Saran wrap. Then rope stanchions had to be assembled and place around each vehicle. Our guys did a magnificent job and impressed both the AACA National Staff and the hotel staff.

On Thursday, February 8, the convention kicked off with registration, trade show set up, a tour and lunch
