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Car of the Month 2006 Nissan Pathfinder LE

In the year 2000, my wife, Pam, decided she wanted and SUV, so we bought a new Dodge Durango for her. After a couple of years commuting with it, she no longer wanted the Durango because the parking at her work was too tight for the truck and the gas mileage was terrible. She replaced the Durango with a 1999 Mercury Mystique. This small car allowed her to park easily and had much improved gas




2006 Nissan Pathfinder 4x4 LE

mileage despite it being the V-6 engine instead of the standard four cylinder engine. By 2006, she moved to a Nissan dealership in our hometown that had ample parking space, and she decided she wanted to go back to an SUV. Since she was working for Nissan, we leased a 2006 Nissan Pathfinder LE, marking the first time we ever leased a car.

True to our natures, this vehicle was loaded. It stickered at \$40,879, but we got it for \$35,508. As an LE model, it had all the luxury options and was comparable to our 2004 Nissan Armada, which we still had. So let's do some comparing. The Pathfinder had a 4.0 L V-6

engine making 265 horsepower, the Armada had a 5.6 L V-8 engine making 317 horsepower. The Pathfinder was a three row SUV carrying up to seven passengers, while the Armada was a three row SUV carrying up to eight passenger. The Armada was much bigger overall than the Pathfinder, both wider and longer. The surprise came when comparing the gas

mileage. Looking at highway driving the Armada could muster only 16 miles per gallon, while the Pathfinder with its lighter weight and smaller, less powerful engine got a whopping 17 miles per gallon. Considering the difference in capability for comfort, passenger accommodation and towing ability (the Armada superior in all three areas), the Pathfinder was a clear disappointment in fuel economy.

On the plus side the Pathfinder was as well appointed as the Armada. The transmission was a five speed automatic with power disc brakes, power windows, power steering and dual zone air conditioning. It had a power sunroof and roof rack plus heated side view

mirrors. On the inside the Pathfinder sported a Homelink garage door system, intermittent windshield wipers, heated leather seats, a Bose AM/FM 6-Disc CD stereo radio, a navigation system, an interactive trip computer system including tire inflation, memory seats, wood trim pieces and a DVD player. All in all, you could not ask for more in a vehicle in 2006. It even had its own First Aid kit in the rear door.

There really are not many stories to tell in using the Pathfinder. Since the advantage in gas mileage was negligible, family trips were mostly done in the Armada due to the extra room. Pam used this vehicle to commute back and forth to work and for grocery runs and not much more. We kept this SUV for only a year and a half due to several circumstances in the family.

We had owned a 1998 Volkswagen Jetta several years back. When my father need a new car, we sold him the Jetta in 2000 thus starting this saga of Pam's cars. In early 2008, my father passed away and the

The following article entitled "Public Relations/Event Planning" was written by Steven Rossi, AACA Vice President—Public Relations & Event Planning. It was originally published in the Winter 2024 Rummage Box.

The practice of managing and disseminating information to create a positive perception is known as public relations. For 2023, AACA welcomed the most recent 25 -year-old and older antiques through a "Class of 1998" Press Release...along with press releases for the new ½ -year Membership Allowance, the Zenith Award, the Eastern Fall National Meet and more.

In addition, we broke new ground by adding narration to the Friday morning assemblance of Show cars ... which we affectionately refer to as "Morning Glory" ... at the Hershey Meet. Thanks to the kind cooperation of the Hershey Region. An *Antique Automobile* (Jan./Feb. 2024) feature, called "Aging Demographic + Information Overload," was also developed to encourage member-ship engagement in support of the Club's wellbeing.

All told, 1,349 traditional media stories and 345 social media mentions were realized. Which translates to \$19 million in Advertising value. Our official Facebook Organization page is up to 12,257 followers while the AACA Group page enjoys 24,166 members. Some 3,546 also follow us on Instagram.

Meanwhile, we very much accelerated our Annual Convention intentions through an interdisciplinary Board of Directors and Headquarters Staff team effort with coordinated process. Our 2024 Annual Convention & National Awards Banquet in Chantilly, Virginia, was engineered to provide utmost value and enjoyment at reasonable cost with accommodating and refined convenience.

Our premier host hotel, the Westfields Marriott Washington Dulles, was named Marriot's Premium Hotel of the Year. Two generous sponsorships came our way in response to our demonstrated commitment to elevate the event. The NB Center for American Automotive

Heritage served as Presenting Sponsor while J.C. Taylor graciously supported the newly initiated Casino Night. Two additional, anonymous donations...which were quite significant...kindly materialized, as well.

A continuing series of full-page *Antique Automobile* ads, ongoing *Speedster* support, three AACA e-Mail blasts and a hard copy promotional mailer (donated) to all members served to promote the 2024 Convention. With over 500 members in attendance, 36 Seminars and Meeting Sessions were presented. Over 20 Vendors registered for the Trade Show and attendees were treat-ed to a visit to the Udvar-Hazy Center of the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum. There have been 4,500 Views on the AACA Forum Convention topic. The local AACA Bull Run Region actively supported the cause and congratulations to all the National Award Winners!

Finally, the 2025 Annual Convention is already contracted and under development. It will be held at the Embassy Suites Charlotte-Concord/Golf Resort & Spa in North Carolina from February 6-9, 2025. We look for-ward to seeing you there!

What's In a Name

This article presents a badge or logo and provides a brief explanation of the item. The source for the following information was derived from the book "Car Marques" by Siimon Heptinstall and embellished by my personal experiences..

The Mercury Division of Ford Motor Company was founded in 1938 by Edsel Ford. While the logos of individual motorcar manufacturers are a vital part of marketing, the emblems of sub-brands created by a manufacturer are even more important. Badge engineering, or simply renaming models from a different marque, has long been a part of the auto industry. Distinctive brand logos are essential for this, because they may signify the only difference between the models.

Ford created its new, moderately upscale marque after considering more than 100 different names. Most of the models sold during Mercury's 73-year history were renamed, redesigned, or revamped Ford models, often with the slight addition of chrome and nicer seats. Some notable examples are the Ford Mustang and Mercury Cougar, Ford Maverick and Mercury Comet and the Ford Crown Victoria and Mercury Grand Marquis.

The first badge selected to represent this new brand, which was intended to sit in the market somewhere between standard Fords and luxury Lincolns, was a portrait of the Roman god Mercury wearing his speed -enhancing winged hat. To the Romans, Mercury was the messenger of the gods and know for his speed winged helmet and sandals. This classical motif of Mercury's head and helmet also sometimes functioned as a hood ornament. However in the boom times of the 1950s, a new, more modern Mercury emblem appeared, known as "The Big M". As the name

suggests, this was a capital letter "M" with long horizontal bars extending from both sides.

The final Mercury badge appeared in the more challenging marketplace of the 1980s. It seemed to be a graphic representation of the winged helmet, with three silver bent lines within a double roundel. Despite the more modern badge, Mercury sales continued to fall in the 21st century. The last model was produced in 2011.







Meet Rules

- All show vehicles will be classified by Bull Run Region upon arrival, and decisions are final.
- Stock vehicles, Class A, must be 25 years or older and reflect equipment available for the year and model vehicle except for minor upgrades and safety modifications.
- Modified vehicles, Class B, must be 25 years old or older based on the vehicle's state registration.
- Post-1998 vehicles, whether stock or modified, are in Class C.
- Vehicles may be displayed as the owner wishes within the space allotted and must not interfere with other participants or traffic flow. Hoods must be open for best-of-show judging.
- All vehicles should have a charged fire extinguisher available.
- Vehicles must be driven onto the show field under their own power.
- Once parked, vehicles must remain turned off until the meet is over at approximately 3:00 pm.
- Vehicles needing to exit earlier must be escorted off the field. Contact a Bull Run member to arrange escort.
- Cars with "For Sale" and/or "Raffle" signs must be in the Car Corral and registered for the show as such.
- No alcoholic beverages are permitted.
- No food sales unless authorized in advance by Bull Run Region.
- Pre-registration fees are non-refundable except for show cancellation by Bull Run Region.
- Late arrivals (after 11 am) may not be eligible for judging.
