THE WRAP-UP

After many months of planning, our 64th show is now behind us. Prior to show day, we had 105 vehicles pre-registered, with 82 of those asking to be class judged. The weather co-operated, aside from it being chilly in the morning. We ended up with 30 no-shows (a 71% turnout) but once the sun seemed to be peeking out, we got another 27 in Late Registration, so we ultimately had 102 on the field, a respectable showing. Chief Judge Jim Stup and his team of judges awarded 44 1st-Place, 11 2nd-Place, and 2 3rd-Place trophies. Of the Special Awards, Bob Engle's team matched 28 categories to qualifying vehicles. See lists of all winners on pages 5-6. Flea Market Chair Jeff Feltner reports he had 15 spaces filled.

In 1978 this Corvette was spotted by my Father-in-Law. It was in a doctor's yard parked under a tree in Upperville, VA. He knew he could give the car the renewed life it deserved. He bought it from the good doctor. He went through it mechanically and repaired and serviced it as needed. It was then sent off for

fresh paint and a new top. He then enjoyed the Corvette for 22 years. In 2000 Warren purchased a second Corvette, a 1974 model, and he gave the '65 to his daughter Cindy. Cindy and I found it a lot of fun taking trips in the Vette. When we were married, we used it for our honeymoon trip to the beach. Over the next few years, it was becoming obvious that the paint was deteriorating, and it was showing some wear. It was time for another restoration. Cindy preferred the car be given some personality during this transition. We like the muscle car look and sound of the Corvettes rival – the Shelby Cobra. So, we gave the Corvette the "Cobra Killer" treatment - wider tires which resulted in wider fenders and side pipe headers to let out the rumble of the 1965 high horsepower engine. Cindy and I continue to enjoy taking trips in the Corvette. In 2018 we traveled 10k miles over the course of three weeks. That trip included camping (Yellowstone Park -we carried our camping gear in the spare tire well), Canada (Boutchart Gardens), Pacific Coast Highway, Grand Canyon, Route 66 and a great deal of other fond experiences. This car has received and given renewed life.

These cars feature independent rear suspension because rather than having a conventional transmission and rear differential setup, these cars featured a rear transaxle. Next up is a '67 Firebird 400.

My estimation is 4 to 6 months for completion, but who knows. 1 step forward and 6 steps backward. *[Larry, a lot of members know exactly what you mean...Looks beautiful!]*

1001 E. Cork St. Winchester From Pleasant Valley Rd, turn east onto E. Cork St. There are 2 Park entrances - make Right turn at first light (first entrance).

Turn left directly in front of the War Memorial Bldg (red blob on map next to "Jim Barnett Park" text), and drive past the ball fields. At the T, turn Right and follow the road (Oak Dr) south to the Y. Bear left at the Y, and follow the road past the dog park (on your left) to the dead end at the Antique Car Shelter. There is a gravel parking lot, or you can park on the grass beyond it. Alternately, you can take the 2nd Park entrance from Cork St and follow Oak Dr as outlined above. No restroom facilities at the shelter, but the War Memorial Bldg is open to the public.

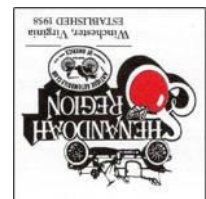
