


# THE CLUTCH CHATTER

A man at work asked my opinion of old Volvo 240s as he knew I had a station wagon. I gave him my opinion. A few weeks later he told me he had had his non-Volvo daily driver to a local garage for maintenance. The garage, in Falls Church, had been a Volvo specialty shop through the 1990s and still is to some degree. My friend told me he had seen an unusual Volvo there while picking up his driver. He described it as a small, yellow station wagon, with a "For Sale" sign on it. In 1973, I had looked at a used 1972 1800 ES, with the intent of having my mother retire her Vega wagon, but decided

against it due to poorly repaired body damage. However I sustained my want of ownership of an 1800 ES for the following fifty years.

The Volvo 1800 ES was built for only two model years, in late 1971 as a 1972 model and 1973. To be clear Volvo 1800 cars were produced since the mid-1960s, but not as an ES. The "E" designated the engine had a Bosch Jetronic fuel injection system and the "S" stands for Sweden. The car has an 1800 cc engine making 125 horsepower. This engine is mated to an M41 manual, four-speed transmission witha Laycock de Normanville overdrive. It is equipped with four-wheel disc brakes, weighs 2690 pounds and is 171.3 inches long with

a 96.5 inch wheelbase. This sporty shooting brake, as Europeans would call it, has a top speed of 113 miles per hour. Over its two year model run 8,077 vehicles were produced. The line was dropped by Volvo due to the increased U.S. Federal requirement for safety and emissions which would have significantly increased the production costs.

I went to that Falls Church shop on my way home the same day, but the car was gone, picked up by its owner, but the shop man gave me the owner's contact infrequent usage and garaged privilege. He had kept information. I called, left a message, and on the road to a show in Carlisle the next day the owner called and we set a meeting up at his home in Burke. He had bought the car on a whim from the Alexandria Volvo dealer in the late 1970's when he was there buying a new 242 GT sedan. As the 1800 ES sat that day, decades later in his driveway and pulled out from the garage (next to a '67 Mustang that was covered in packing boxes) it was clear the car was not in show condition as it was. I, always suspicious of rust and other chassis unknowns, said I wanted to put it up on my lift at home for inspection. The owner agreed as I live nearby. It should not have passed that state inspection the week before. Certain deficiencies





agreement was reached. What saved this car was its it maintained to a degree. He had had it repainted the original color in 1980 by a man who worked at the Plymouth dealer, and the forty year old job has held up well. The leather interior is original and nicely

The monthly meeting of the Bull Run Region was held on June 9, 2024 at the Manassas VFW Hall at 4 pm. 15 members were in attendance.

- 1. Pledge of Allegiance
- 2. Treasurer's Report: Read and accepter.
- 3. Pete presented Robert Baker with a 50 year Vietnam Veteran pin and certificate as part of an ongoing project to recognize all remaining Vietnam Veterans. He then discussed the August Picnic meeting reminding everyone to bring a side dish or dessert to share plus their own personal utensils, plates and drinks. Folding chairs are also welcome. He then put out a plea for members to submit articles and pictures to both the Clutch Chatter and the Region website. As members go to shows or other car related activities in the area, please take pictures and draft a short write up on the event and send them in to share with the other members. Especially needed are Car of the Month submissions. There are nearly 100 interesting cars in the Region, but only about 25% of them have been featured. Please submit your pictures and story.
- 4. Randy Higgins updated the members on the Rohr Show. He stated that the agreement with the Masonic Lodge has been signed and that the committee has resolved the traffic flow problem from last year. He stated that the online registration is up and running but learned that the Region will not receive the registration fees until after the event. While this is not ideal, it has only a minimal impact for the Region. He also learned more about the automated voting package offered by this company, but was not impressed it. While we will still consider using this process for next year, it is not likely the Region will sign onto it, especially as we already have an efficient tallying system developed in-house by Rob Morrow. John Price reported that some registrations are coming in. He used the online system for his car and learned that it was very easy to use but costs an extra \$3 over our fee for the service provider.
- 5. Franklin reported that the ODMA Show in Roanoke was a success, but operated at a loss. While no claims have been made as yet, the Region may be asked, along with all the other ODMA Regions to help defray the costs. He also thanked Sam Elsworth for bringing some past ODMA dash plaques.

- 6. John Price suggested the Region develop a generic contact business card members could carry with them. When they see someone with an interesting collector car, they can provide the card as an enticement to join the Region. Pete and Randy will work up the design. Ernie Newland who can print the cards said the cost would be nominal.
- 7. John Price won the 50/50 drawing and donated his winnings back to the Region.

Members can now join and renew online simply by selecting the Join/Renew Today Button. The area for Regions is where you can find information about the clos-est region or chapter. The webmaster and editors can also find logos here for their websites and articles. There is a link to the various forms that a region may need from time to time.

The **Publications** drop down displays the list of publications that can be viewed. You will find the AACA Policy & Procedures Manual and the AACA Bylaws in this list. You are talking to a prospective member and don't have your magazine with you? No problem, just open the web-site on your phone and open the magazine from Publications. Or maybe you have a question about judging? You can review the judging guidelines in Publications. You will also find a very concise vehicle classification document. Two very important publications in this section are the Speedster and the Rummage Box.

If you are not getting the *Speedster* in your email, you should update your email with Headquarters. The Speedster is a great way to stay in touch and get the very latest news. The *Rummage Box* is full of articles that the news-letter editors love to use in their newsletters.

### What's In a Name

This article presents a badge or logo and provides a brief explanation of the item. The source for the following information was derived from the book "Car Marques" by Siimon Heptinstall and embellished by my personal experiences.

This specialist sports car manufacturer was founded by the British inventor and engineer Anthony Colin Bruce Chapman in 1952. Although Chapman was normally known as Colin, the overlapping four initial letters of his mane form the center of the Lotus badge. The initials and the brand name stand on a triangle of the traditional motorsport color, British Racing Green, within a yellow circle, symbolizing the sunny days Chapman believed lay ahead.

A company legend about the original badge hints at Chapman's maverick character. It is said that he led his original financial partners, Michael and Nigel Allen, to believe that the letters stood for Colin Chapman and Allen Brothers. The name Lotus, meanwhile, was believed to have been chosen because Chapman's pet-name for his wife Hazel was "my Lotus flower."

In 1968 the colors of the badge were replaced with a black background. This was intended as a temporary

tribute to British World Champion Formula One driver Jim Clark, who died racing in a Lotus. The chaotic Lotus parts division occasionally used up stocks of these black badges randomly over the following years. Some enthusiasts believe these "black-badged"





cars had up-rated performance or engines.

The black badge was also used after the death of founder Chapman in 1982. The company then went through several owners with corresponding branding changes. For a while, Chapman's initials were dropped and the badge changed to a gold marque name on a green oval. None of the new varieties seemed to work, though, and eventually the traditional Lotus badge was restored.

Always known for their small, light weight, high performance cars, Lotus, while no longer in Formula One racing, is still prevalent in other types of automobile racing. Lotus cars can be seen on both the movies and on television. Harking back to the 1960, can anyone forget Mrs. Peel of the Avengers British TV series and her Lotus Elan or her replacement Tara King in her Lotus Europa. A Lotus can also be seen in the James Bond film "The Spy Who Loved Me", and the movie "Honey, I Blew Up the Kids" an the 1960s TV series the Prisoner.

Editors Note: A friend in my college dormitory had a Lotus Europa. He offered to take me for a ride. I jumped at the chance but was thwarted by the car itself. It was so small and low to the ground that I could not get my six foot, one inch frame into the passenger's seat.





A "Whale" of a Discovery was found in the Martin Marietta Carmel Church Quarry in 1990. The first bones found included neck vertebrae dating from 14 million years ago and were excavated in 1991-2. More than 50% of the skeleton was recovered, making it one of the most complete fossilized whales discovered in the Eastern United States. The whale was identified as a new species from that period, based on the difference in ear bones.
