

AUGUST CAR OF THE MONTH Bruce & Judi Hall's 1972 BMW 2002tii



This all-original 1972 BMW 2002tii was manufactured in Feb. 1972 and delivered to Frankfurt, Germany. Bruce Hall's father, Jim Hall, previously had a 1969 model (in "ugly green" per Bruce) that was totaled in a wreck. Jim decided to use the insurance money from the

totaled car to order this new one from a dealer in Huntington, WV. The options were a sunroof, alloy wheels, special

seat material, antifreeze, and XAS tires, and he negotiated an AM radio option for free. On the way home from the dealer, Jim talked to a Porsche friend who was headed to Germany on business. The friend would take




delivery of the car in Frankfurt, drive the car during his visit, then take the car to the port to be shipped to Baltimore, MD, a big cost savings on import. A few weeks later, Jim got notice that the car was delivered. Bruce and his parents headed to Baltimore and drove the BMW back home to Charleston, WV, and it has remained in the family ever





Once safe at home, the family used it in autocross. hill climbs, and rallying as well as a regular driver on tours and fun trips. A ride in the BMW became a reward for members of the extended family - as the

youngsters obtained their driver's licenses, the rite of passage was celebrated by a ride in the car (but chauffeured by Jim, of course). The car was always meticulously cleaned after every outing. The engine is a 4cylinder, 4-stroke inline engine, with overhead cam shaft. Engine capacity is



121.3 cu. in. and it has 140 hp. Max speed is 116 mph (manual). Acceleration is 0-60 in 9.9 secs. The trunk is equipped with the original elephant hide vinyl and white edging strips on the wheel wells.

After his Dad passed away in 2008, Bruce began regularly showing the car in his Dad's honor. The BMW has won

awards at the Classic on the James. Best in Class at the Hilton Head Concours in 2009. First in Class at the Ault Concours in 2010: it has



won awards at the Glenmoor Gathering Concours, and won the Preservation Class at Hilton Head Concours. When shown with its original buyer's order, window sticker, books, service records, tools, and dealer brochure, its originality is evident, and the car has become a standard of originality for a U.S. version of a 1972 BMW 2002tii.



In May 2022, Bruce and Judi attended the Greenbrier Concours d'Elegance held at the famed Greenbrier resort in White Sulphur Springs, WV. The Halls entered the BMW in the "Unrestored 1970 and Newer" class, and won one of the

two Springhouse Awards in their class. Since the May show date was almost exactly 50 years to the date the BMW was originally purchased, talented Judi crafted a paper "birthday cake" for their car for the occasion and

handed out packets of M&Ms to the attendees. The paper cake was a brilliant idea for a rainy weekend, as everyone knows what happens to REAL cake left out in the rain...

With plenty of food & drink it was a great day celebrating our Flag and Independence Day.









FROM TOM PARKER: VA MUSEUM OF TRANSPORTATION

My son's soccer team travelled to Salem, VA for the VHSL State Tournament in early June. They unfortunately lost in the semi-final game, but while we were in town we went to Roanoke to the check out the Virginia Transportation Museum. The museum is fairly large and located in an old train depot. They have cars, trains (full size and model), planes, and buses all covered. When you walk into the wing with the cars, they are lined up on both sides with about 30 cars total. There were a handful of Studebakers, including a late 1800s wagon.





There was a 1913 Detroit Electric which cost a whopping \$3000 at that time. For the Mopar fans, there was a



1970 Superbird, 1970 Charger and 1955 Chrysler 300. Of the early cars on display were the 1923 Piedmont, which was the only car company ever chartered in the Commonwealth of Virginia, and a 1923 REO. The train yard had several locomotives and cars that could be walked though.







1001 E. Cork St. Winchester From Pleasant Valley Rd, turn east onto E. Cork St. There are 2 Park entrances - make Right turn at first light (first entrance). Turn left directly in front of the War Memorial Bldg (red blob on map next to "Jim Barnett Park" text), and drive past the ball fields. At the T, turn Right and follow the road (Oak Dr) south to the Y. Bear left at the Y, and follow the road

past the dog park (on your left) to the dead end at the Antique Car Shelter. There is a gravel parking lot, or you can park on the grass beyond it. Alternately, you can take the 2nd Park entrance from Cork St and follow Oak Dr as outlined above. No restroom facilities at the shelter, but the War Memorial Bldg is open to the public.


