48th Annual Edgar Rohr Memorial Car Meet

On September 21, 2024, the Bull Run Region conducted the 48th annual Edgar Rohr Memorial Car Meet. This was our second year at the Manasseth Lodge 182 facility in Manassas, Virginia, and it was another rewarding experience. Modifying the show field layout from last year corrected the traffic flow problems and provided a better plan for the display of the show cars. This year, there were 100 vehicles on display, which was down from the 132 vehicles last year, but the quality of the vehicles did not change. Perhaps the various long-range weather forecasts calling for rain dampened (pun intended) registrations, but the weather actually proved perfect with lots of sunshine, low humidity and moderate temperature.

Whatever the reason for the reduced numbers, everyone had a wonderful time. The Model T Club put on their demonstration of building a Ford Model T pickup in under 15 minutes. There were also seven vendors present selling everything from homemade fudge to motorcycles. You could even purchase fresh made ice cream using churns powered by an antique hit-or-miss engine.

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Wow! What a show we put on. The 48th Annual Edgar Rohr Memorial Car Meet set some new records this year. Thanks to the influence of the people at the National Weather Service, with some help from the Big Man above, the weather turned out perfect. We hosted 100 vehicles this year, which is slightly less than last year. Perhaps the long range forecast calling for rain reduced participation. The quality of the show cars was evident and in keeping with our past shows. We were missing a Rolls-Royce this year. Sorry, it was in the shop. We had seven vendors this year. One unique vendor sold homemade ice cream made from his churns that were powered by an antique John Deere hit-or-miss engine. This year we also had Witt's Harley Davidson participating with the intent of attracting more motorcycles to our show.

Our friends at Crusin-For-Heroes were with us once again raising money for the Fisher House military charity. Through donations from registrations, day of monetary donations and the 50/50 drawing, they managed once again to earn over \$1,000 for the charity. Crusin-For-Heroes give every dollar raised to Fisher House. A special thanks must go to the winner of the 50/50 drawing who donated back his winnings. Our silent auction earned the Region over \$400 much of this due to BR Member Pete Daniels who donated several items yielding over \$200 in themselves. Also, thanks to Jon Battle for running the silent auction.

This year our award sponsorships were through the roof. Usually, the Region picks up the tab for about 20 of the awards. This year the Region had to sponsor only 5 awards with all the others being sponsored by businesses or individuals. Many thanks to everyone who made this happen. Additional thanks to Dave Claveloux who signed up six new members for the Region.

Special thanks to Nicki Hudson who handled all the door prizes and, of course, the money. The same for Jennifer Gilkey who ran the Club Store and all the other members who helped make this effort a success. I also thank the Manasseth Lodge 182 for providing the venue and Scout Troop 884 for conducting the flag ceremony. Lastly, I give my extreme gratitude to John Price for running registration, Franklin Gage our Chief Judge and our two co-chairmen Gene Gilkey and Randy Higgins. None of this would have happened if it weren't for your tireless efforts.

The National Beat

The following article entitled “AACA Youth Scholarships” was written by Greg Jackson, AACA Vice President, Youth Development and Awards. It was originally published in the Summer 2024 Rummage Box.

As we head into the full swing of summertime, our thoughts turn to beach trips, family vacations and weekend car shows. The long days and warm nights make it feel like December is forever from now. However, it’s not too early to start thinking about the December 1 deadline for AACA Scholarships.

AACA has a strong commitment to students who have demonstrated an active interest and participation in the antique car hobby through restoration, preservation and/or ownership of antique cars. AACA awards three types of \$1500 scholarships. In addition privately funded scholarships are awarded as funds become available. Awards will be presented in February 2025 at the AACA National Convention in Concord NC. Applications are available online at www.aaca.org/scholarships with full details on each award available, as well as all requirements. Completed applications must be received by December 1, 2024 in order to be considered. Please note the below summaries are just that- summaries. Full details and requirements are available online.

The Young People’s Award requires that the applicant be nominated by a Region or Chapter of AACA. Children and Grandchildren of AACA members are eligible, who are enrolled in an accredited institution of higher learning for either a bachelor’s degree or vocational program.

The AACA Scholarship Award is granted to encourage individuals to further their education and stimulate interest in AACA and the history of vehicles in general. This award has the same requirements as the Young People’s Award, except nomination by a region or chapter is not required.

The John and Janet Ricketts Leadership Scholarship is for a child or grandchild of an AACA member that is enrolled in an accredited institution of higher learning for either a bachelor’s degree or vocational program. The applicant must demonstrate active interest in AACA through participation in it’s programs or interest in the hobby of antique vehicles through

The Susquehannock Region Automotive Technology Scholarship is a cash award to a student currently enrolled in an institution of higher learning

leading to a degree in antique auto restoration or automotive technology.

Hershey Region AACA Automotive Restoration Scholarship is granted by the Hershey Region AACA to students to further their education and stimulate interest in AACA and automotive history. One or more awards may be presented each year. Selection will be made by the AACA Scholarship Award Committee, the then current President of the Hershey Region and current chair of the region education committee.

The Louise Bianchi Chiotti Memorial Scholarship is based on the same rules as the AACA Automotive Technology award and is awarded as funds are available. It was instituted and funded by Dave and Marilyn Chiotti as a way to honor Louise and continue to support the hobby. .

Please encourage your eligible students to send in their applications prior to December 1, 2024.

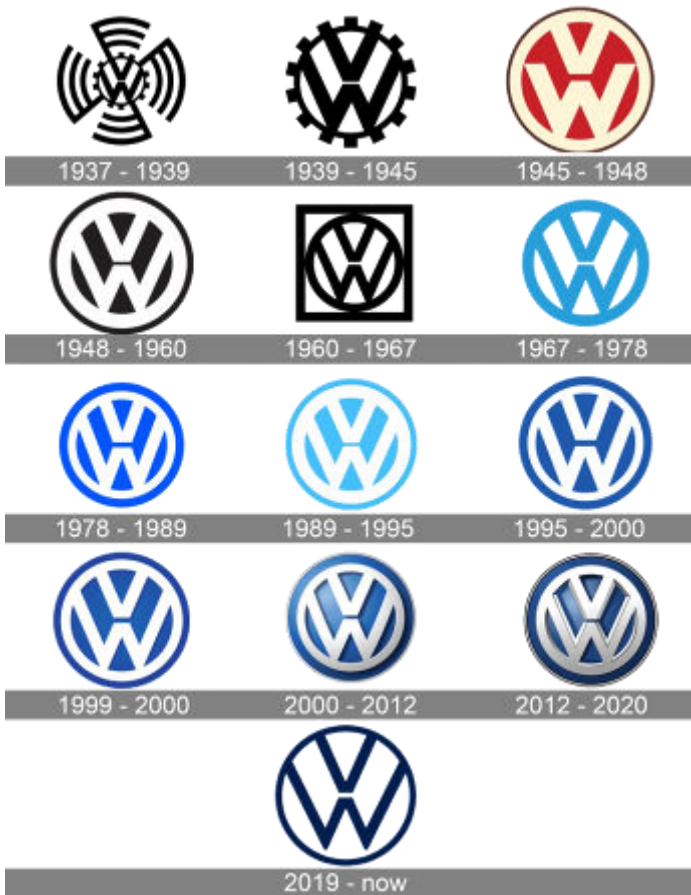
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What's In a Name

This article presents a badge or logo and provides a brief explanation of the item. The information in this article was derived from open, internet sources modified by my edits.

The name Volkswagen translates from German as “car for the people”. The brand was created out of Adolf Hitler’s idea. He wanted to build a superhighway and make vehicles more affordable for people. The idea was born in 1933, when Hitler visited an auto show in Berlin. A year later he became the leader of Germany and invited Ferdinand Porsche to launch the production of “people’s cars”. The brand’s symbol is composed of two letters: “V” for “Volks”, people, and “W” for “Wagen”, vehicle. The “V” is placed above “W”. The letters are enclosed in a circle. The emblem has changed during the brand’s history, but the basis was created in the very beginning.



In 1939, the first brand’s logo was composed of the two letters “V” and “W”, placed one above another, with a frame, representing a cogwheel. This was surrounded by a graphical rounded interpretation of

swastika symbol. By 1943, the logo was redesigned. The Nazi symbolism was removed, but the cogwheel remain, as well as the lettering. The new logo was practical, brutal and masculine, and the proportions were more balanced.

After the defeat of the Third Reich, in 1945, the brand created its longest-running logo, which was the foundation of the today’s logo. The cogwheel was removed providing a more graphical and strong design with an emphasis on practicality and quality of the product.

The redesign of 1948 switched the color palette of the Volkswagen logo to black and white, and slightly refined the contours of the monogram, reducing the space between the “V” and the “W”, and emboldening the interior outline of the roundel. This version of the badge was used by the German automaker for a decade.

In 1960 the unique square logo was designed. The idea was to maintain the brand’s global image, as it started operating on international markets. The square frame of the new VW logo with its monochrome palette was reflecting the power and stability of the brand.

In seven years the square was gone, bringing back the traditional circle. The design of the new logo was similar to the one from 1945, but more minimalist and elegant. The color scheme was changed to blue and white, showing the blue letters on a white background. The logo form was slightly modified by doubling the frame, the letter “V” became a little smaller. The colors were switched to what is seen on the current logo — white symbol on a blue background. The modifications of this time period were more about the color palette. It remains blue and white, but the blue became lighter and brighter. The proportions were also changed a little.

In 1995 a new shade of blue was adopted for the iconic badge. It became smoother and significantly darker than the one, used for the previous version, which made the whole badge look more professional and serious. This shade was used by Volkswagen for almost five years.

The redesign of 1999 added volume to the Volkswagen badge, adding gradient shades to the blue background of the roundel, and a light shadow to the white lines of the characters. This was a transitional badge between the flat version, and the three-dimensional one introduced a year later.

The new three-dimensional logo was created. The white color got a silver tone, while the blue became calmer and more intense. The proportions are perfectly balanced now. The logo looks powerful. The 3D effect of the new logo is maximized, though the size of an emblem is now reduced. The lines of the letters look sharper and bolder, which gives a logo a strong and confident look, evoking the sense of progress.

The current logo was designed in order to celebrate the brand's launch of electric cars. It is futuristic, simple and sophisticated. The Volkswagen logo came back to a two-dimensional design, which makes in more high-end and stylish. The color scheme of the Volkswagen emblem is a combination of blue and white, where white is used for the letters and blue – as a background. This palette reflects the brand's professionalism and stability, with the main accent on quality. The Volkswagen emblem is instantly recognizable. Its round frame with the brand's initials is well-known all over the globe.

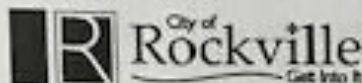

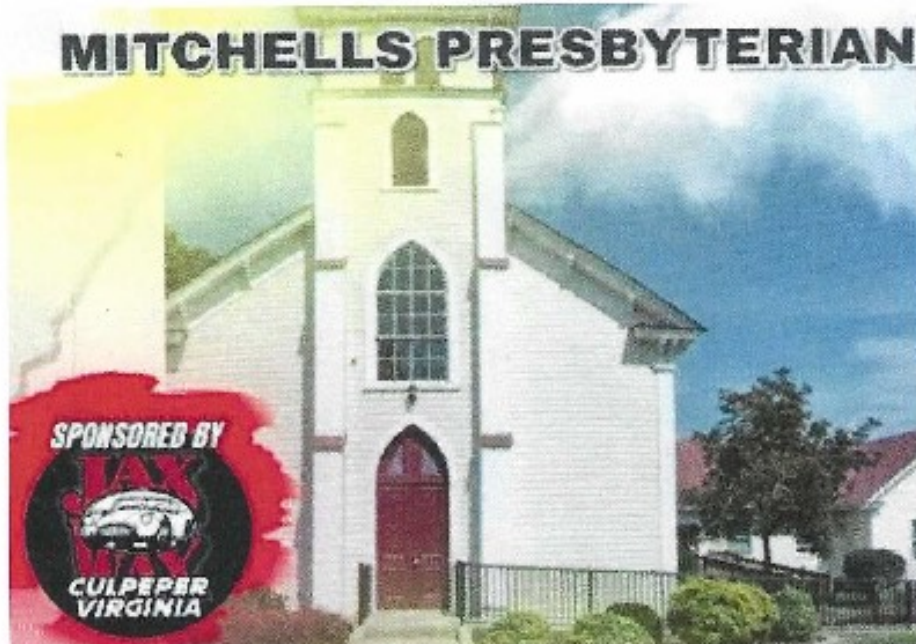

No other foundry in the country casts bells using the swept-loam method, which provides exquisite surface detail, improves concentricity, and allows the metal to cool more slowly, producing a better casting. In addition to bells, they offer a full-service non-ferrous foundry. Sand-molding, lost-wax are two techniques Sunderlin can cast with any alloy.

A **"WHALE" OF A DISCOVERY** was found in the Martin Marietta Carmel Church Quarry in 1990. The first bones found included neck vertebrae dating from 14 million years ago and were excavated in 1991-2. More than 50% of the skeleton was recovered, making it one of the most complete fossilized whales discovered in the Eastern United States. The whale was identified as a new species from that period, based on the difference in ear bones. The Latin name is *Eobalaenoptera Harrisoni*, recorded in 2004.

Virginia Museum of History and Culture was founded in 1831 as the Virginia Historical Society. It is the oldest curated collection in Virginia, totaling more than nine million items. Featured during this visit is a special exhibition celebrating the first Lego Factory in the United States.
